





“A Certain Slant of Light” by Laura Whitcomb


“City of Bones” by Cassandra Clare


“Evermore” by Alyson Noel


“Fallen” by Kate Lauren


“Intertwined” by Gena Showalter


“Lips Touch: Three Times” by Lani Taylor

From a writer of unparalleled imagination and emotional insight come three stories of supernatural love -- tales about the deliciousness of wanting and waiting for that moment when lips touch.




“Marked: House of Night” by P.C. Cast
