




“The Chosen “ by Kristina Ohlsson


A brand new thriller featuring Investigative analysts Bergman and Recht of the Stockholm police. A preschool teacher is gunned down by a sniper in front of her building as children and the parents picking them up looked on in horror. Just two hours later two 10-year-old boys are kidnapped. The two crimes couldn't be more different yet both have targeted members of an extremely small community. Even more disturbing, counterterrorist chief Lundell seems to know more than he's willing to share with the police. Following the trail of violence and revenge takes Bergman to Israel and back to produce a twisted, gripping and ultimately shattering tale.



How Will I Know You? by Jessica Treadway


Joy's body is found a month after she goes missing and presumed drowned. When the police chief arrests one of the few black men in town the consequences take their toll on everyone: the accused, his lover, the chief's daughter and her husband, and Joy's best friend. Told out of chronology and through different characters' voices exploring how they are able to find redemption and peace as they come to terms with their loss. Though it can be read as a mystery, the book is more truly a set of intricate character sketches revealing deep flaws and human weaknesses but also examining how people live with their most overwhelming mistakes.
